UF-373 FLORIDA MUSEUM OF NATURAL HISTORY SPECIAL COLLECTIONS BUILDING

PRESENTING: JOEY MANDESE, PD&C

DISCUSSION:

Joey Mandese presented a project to create a single collection facility building to house specimens which are currently located in Dickinson Hall. This building will be designed to contain 40 million plus specimens and will be located on the south side of the Florida Museum of Natural History. There will be no parking impact to the area and no change in the current vehicle access to the museums. No one will be working at this building. This facility is for the central storing of specimens. The committee discussed the following:

- Shared access with the Doyle Connor Building
- Use of building access from 34th Street
- Truck access to building – Wide turn area.
- Types of specimens to be stored
 - ✓ Large specimens preserved in alcohol
 - ✓ Frozen tissues
- Parking at the building
 - ✓ No designation change to 5 parking spaces at the building
 - ✓ Service vehicle parking

ACTION:

A motion to approve the project was set by Bruce Welt and seconded by Scott Washburn. The committee approved this project.
